I refer to your request dated 12th April 2022 made under the Freedom of Information Act 2014, which was received on by my office on that date, for records held by Iarnród Éireann.

Request:

- Any reports, plans, memos, or other documents which outline whether or not Irish Rail trains broke speed limits that were put in place during Storm Eunice in February

Response:

Following a search of our systems, I can confirm that Iarnród Éireann did not receive any reports of overspeed during the Storm Eunice on the 18th of February this year.

Rights of appeal

The appeal will involve a complete reconsideration of the matter by a more senior member of the staff of this body.
