## Response IE\_FOI\_408

- a) The purchase of the machine fleet number 710 (including the date of purchase and price of said machine): On-Track-Machine (OTM) 710 was delivered in November 2007 at a cost
- b) The function of the machine fleet number 710 (including the intended purpose for its purchase): Dynamic Track Stabilisers (DTS) are normally used to stabilise newly relayed track, following track renewal.
- c) The work history of machine fleet number 710 (including dates and locations of its use): OTM 710 has not operated on IE's network. This was due to a lack of demand for the machine as a result of a downturn in track renewal activity since 2008/2009, following the global economic crash. However, due to an increase in track relaying requirements, in particular the multi annual programme to renew the Dublin to Cork main line, the machine is currently undergoing an assessment at Portlaoise Rail Depot with a view to bringing the machine into service in the near future.
- d) The maintenance of machine fleet number 710 (including dates and locations of maintenance): OTM 710 has been in Care & Maintenance in IE's Depot in Cork Yard since March 2014, this involves a regime of routine inspection and testing (including starting the machine) to ensure that its condition does not deteriorate.
- e) The storage of machine fleet number 710 (including dates periods and locations of storage): OTM 710 has been stored under a Care & Maintenance regime in IE's Depot in Cork Yard since March 2014. Since April 2020 OTM 710 has been relocated to IE's Portlaoise Depot to undergo assessment to bring the machine into service.
