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In summary, Portmarnock was used 19 nights over the course of 12 months. All of these Road Rail Vehicles travel on the back of a low loader truck so there would be trucks in the area as well.

All planning documentation relating to the station is available from the County Council. Regarding the other parts of this request there is a significant portfolio associated with the station. I can arrange for this information to be copied. However, to do this will take 10 days at 8 hours per day totalling a cost of $\leq 1,600$ payable by requestor.

Request 3:

Copies of any customer complaints relating to the use of the station car park.

To date, there has been 3 customer complaints from residents in the St. Marnock's Bay estate:

- 1. The resident at X The Lawn, complained re nose from night-time track work in the area on Mon night/Tues morning 26th March 2019
- 2. The resident at X The Lawn, complained re noise from the track/access point on 24th April 2019. This related to the major track renewal works in the area at that time.

I had hoped that this issue would not become contentious, but night after night there is loud heavy machinery sitting at Portmarnock Dart station. The works are not being carried out at the station, but instead the station appears to be used as a depot. I am looking across at the station now and see see two tractors, three diggers and other heavy machinery being stored in the car park during the day time.

I have videos of vehicles loudly reversing, horns beeping, workmen shouting and engines running/revving all between the hours of midnight and 2am. This has happened nearly every night for the past two weeks. The works are not being carried out at the dart station - the machinery leaves and goes somewhere else.

I am not confident that any real steps have been taken to ensure that noise levels are kept down, or to keep residents informed, as you had previously promised.

Irish rail may have had free reign to do what it wanted with the car park and station when there were no houses in the area, but things have changed now. If these issues have not been brought to the attention of senior management yet, I suggest that it is done so now.

I note that documentation relating to my FOI request is being prepared. In the meantime, I am asking now for someone from Irish Rail to engage with me properly on this issue. I am amenable to a phone call or meeting. I want to understand why Irish Rail thinks it can cause or permit heavy machinery to cause a nuisance night after night, at a car park for which it does not have planning permission to operate as a depot. If things cannot be improved, I will have no other choice but to contact Fingal County Council, and to consider further action as appropriate. For now, I have kept this matter private, but if left with no alternative, I have no problem raising this with public representatives of the area and the media.

I am happy to share select copies of the evidence I have gathered.

Again, I am disappointed that this needs to escalate so fast, but it is clear to me that no consideration of the local residents is taking place.

Further to the email I sent yesterday, please include all details of the activities which took place at Portmarnock Dart station last night between 11pm and 1am in my FOI request.

For the avoidance of doubt, in respect of the documents I requested yesterday, I am not requesting any commercially sensitive information - such information can be redacted - only documentation which sets out the dates and times for scheduled construction activities at the dart station, details of what the activities are, who carried them out, who authorised them and any internal discussion in respect of noise, disturbance of residents. Please also include any internal correspondence, emails, notes or memos on the subject matter of my complaint or which refer to the complaint I have raised.

Finally, can I note my dissatisfaction and disappointment that my complaint to you has

fallen on deaf ears. Your Regional Manager has clearly done nothing about the noise activities at the Dart station. There were a number of flat bed trucks sitting in the car park with the engines running for two hours last night, there was a forklift speeding around the car park, and there was numerous bangs from metal objects being dropped. I was fortunate to capture some of this on video.

I recommend that a review of the activities at this Dart station is carried out, in light of the fact that there is now residential development beside it. My preference would be for us to engage in a constructive dialogue and, outside any maintenance of the actual railway line, for Irish Rail to cease using the car park as a construction compound. The fact that this matter was brought to your attention last week and continues to occur does not fill me with confidence.

I look forward to the receipt of this documentation within the statutory time period of 4 weeks.

Finally, now that you have my address and email, you might notify me in advance of any future nighttime use of the car park.

Many thanks for your response dated 3 September.

I have never received any communication from Irish Rail, so I'm not sure have it has been "endeavouring" to notify residents.

Your comments are all noted. I understand that from time to time repair needs to be carried out on the rail way line. However, my complaint and previous email have nothing to do with this. My issue is with the use of the car park as an area for heavy machinery to congregate in late at night. I don't know where all of the machinery is typically stored, but I know it isn't at the Dart station. It appears to me that machinery and trucks come from elsewhere, sit in the car park with their engine's running for 30 min, and then head off to wherever it is they are going. As you know, any historical use of the car park for loading, unloading and associated construction works (i.e. before the construction of residential development in the vicinity) does not grant a carte blanche right to create a nuisance. The windows on our house are triple glazed, but we can still hear the engines running.

In relation to my request for details of the planning permissions held by Irish Rail, I note that although the local authority is the competent body for the enforcement of planning permissions, my request to you is for copies of the relevant planning permission which provide for the storage and use of heavy machinery at the station (excluding for the purpose of repairing the track itself).

Could you please provide me with the following information under the FOI Act:

- 1. Details of all works in the past 12 months which required the use of the car park for heavy machinery
- 2. Copies of all planning documentation relating to the station, including any opinion, internal notes, correspondence or minutes relating to exempted development.
- 3. Copies of any customer complaints relating to the use of the station car park.

For the avoidance of doubt, I do not consent to the disclosure of these emails, or my personal data, should a FOI request be made by any third party now or in the future, which might capture this correspondence.

I hope that use of the car park for the congregation of heavy machinery might be avoided in the future.

Dear

Apologies for the disturbance in your area.

The railway in the Portmarnock area is a key infrastructural asset. In conjunction with providing train services larnród Éireann is statutorily obligated to operate and maintain the railway. The majority of work has to be carried at night, as night-time working allows for the introduction of safe working systems and the suspension of track/electrical systems. Most night-time working is safety critical, and some of it can be noisy and impact on people who own homes/apartments near the operating railway network. Night-time work tends to be more frequent at locations with a greater number of railway assets, such as station areas, access points, bridges etc.

We endeavour to notify residents in advance of planned site specific night-time works and details are also available on the Iarnród Éireann website (see link below). However, there are occasions when some work inevitably has to be carried out at short notice, such as the work you

refer to on the 12th/13th August. The area adjacent to the car park at Portmarnock is used from time to time to marshal machinery/materials and to gain access to the track, and this has been the situation for many years. Most of the use consists of the access/egress of on-track machines for general maintenance works, and on some occasions involves the loading of ballast or other materials.

Any issues relating to planning permissions are a matter for the local authority, and during the planning application process in 2013 for the new housing development adjacent to the car park, larnrod Eireann did make a submission which included a reference to undertaking maintenance activities i.e.

The applicant should be made aware of the normal vibrations and noise emanating from railway operations and maintenance. These developments including the boundary treatment should be so designed to withstand such vibrations and noise. Applicants in this regard should be aware that the railway has the capacity to operate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

If you let me know your address, we will try to ensure that you and your neighbours are advised in advance of any future planned night-time use of the access point. I have also requested our Regional Manager for the area to ensure that all staff and contractors reduce their preparation time at the area to a minimum and keep noise levels as low as possible.
