Dear [Redacted],

I refer to your request dated 02nd October 2017 made under the Freedom of Information Act 2014, which was received on that date for records held by Iarnród Éireann your request sought:

All relevant documentation relating to:

- 1.) All correspondence, documents, records, internal reports, meetings and recommendations relating to the operation of Rosslare Europort, between January 1st, 2013 to present. To include both written and electronic communications.
- 2.) All correspondence, documents, records, internal reports, meetings and recommendations relating to the relocation of the passenger platform at Rosslare Europort. To include both written and electronic communications.
- 3.) All correspondence, documents, records, internal reports, meetings and recommendations relating to the potential closure of the Rosslare to Gorey stretch of rail line. To include both written and electronic communications.

The Act allows for the charging of fees in certain circumstances and this is set out in section 27 of the Act.

I am now writing to you to advise you of the costs of your request. The Act allows for the charging of search, retrieval and copying of records which are within the scope of your request, from within this body as set out in Section 27(2) and (3).

After careful consideration and consultations, I estimate that the services of staff member(s) for 10 hours will be the minimum amount of time required to efficiently complete the 'search and retrieval and copying' work on your request. The prescribed amount chargeable for each such hour is €20.00 resulting in an overall fee of €200.
