These are referenced in paragraphs 3 to 5 of section 3.0 of the attached South Eastern Line Capacity Study that you recently released to me. The text of the paragraphs is as follows: City Centre to Bray (12 miles) • This section is electrified double track. It runs predominantly through built up residential and commercial areas, with sections on the coast	07/12/18
	and through cutting.There are a number of major level crossings along the route at	



Lansdowne Rd., Serpentine Ave., Sandymount Ave., Sydney Parade, Merrion Gates and Bray. These are all manually controlled CCTV crossings.	
• Separate studies have been carried out to determine the feasibility of closing these crossings permanently, with a more detailed study undertaken for the closure of Merrion Gates
